

## 4-H Judging Contest Guide

This guide's purpose is to give the basics of 4-H judging contests and to provide information for further self-study. Judging contests are normally held at 4-H Day and during the County Fair. All 4-H members are eligible to participate and do not need to be enrolled in any specific project(s) to do so.

### Marking cards for quality judging classes

An example of the Kansas 4-H judging card is shown here. Always be sure to mark the class and your name and/or contestant number on each card. Some contests use judging sheets instead of individual cards, however the concept is the same. The items you are judging are placed from BEST to WORST and that correct order of numbers is circled. In the example shown, 1 is the best choice followed by 4, then 2, and 3 is the worst choice, so the class is placed 1423 and that order is circled.
